

The European Student Card Initiative (ESCI)

Student mobility in Europe is in constant development, and so is the need to simplify procedures and to promote greener and student-friendly alternatives.

The Council Recommendation of 05 April 2022 identified the ESCI as a key action to promote simpler, flexible, and easy-to-integrate solutions for student mobility.





What is the European Student Card?

The **European Student Card** is not a new card nor an additional one, but simply each institution's current card, adapted to take on a **European dimension**, and **establishing a common European identity for higher education students**.

With a European Student Card, a student can...



Verify their student status quickly and reliably anywhere in Europe



Access physical and digital services during their mobility, like the library or public transport



What is the European Student Card?

The European Student Card upgrades the student cards of higher education institutions with certain common elements.

ESI*

A digital identifier used to uniquely identify students of European higher education institutions, linking them to a given ESC

* It Is not recommended to print it on the card.

European Student Card Number (ESCN)


A unique card identifier that serves to identify student cards belonging to a given institution and to validate their student status



European Student Card logo* / QR code

Combines the European elements (text & flag) with a QR code, certifying the cards authenticity across Europe and enabling the validation of student status

* The new ESC logo replaces the previous combination of hologram + QR code).





Creating value for the ESC

The ESC aims to enable students from Higher education institutions to access various on- and off-campus services when on mobility abroad in Erasmus+ Countries.



The **European Student Card** "upgrades" existing student cards and does not necessarily impact the services already offered or associated with the cards. With an ESC, a student's status can be verified securely and in real time, helping to create a European dimension among student cards issued in different countries.



The **principle of reciprocity** plays a key role as a commitment in the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education. Higher education institutions should strive, as much as possible, to offer incoming mobility students the same services provided to their own students. This ensures that their own students can expect equivalent treatment when participating in mobility programs abroad.

What else is the project team working on this year?



Developing a **service catalogue** to better understand the service ecosystem in different countries and provide more transparency on available services.



Building lasting partnerships with strategic service providers to expand the range of services available for ESC cardholders and enhance its added value towards students.



Supporting digitalisation in the field of education, creating and disseminating standard specifications for a **digital European Student Card**.



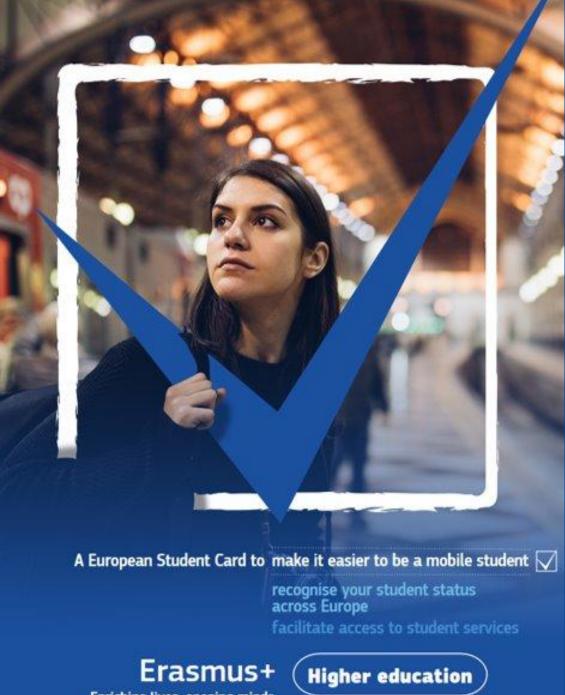


The Norwegian Agency for Shared Services in Education and Research (SIKT), has developed an application that allows Norwegian higher education institutions to issue ESCs. In this model, cards are issued by SIKT, acting as a third-party processor, on behalf of the participating institutions.



The Lithuanian National Union of Students (LSS) has begun issuing ESCs to all interested Lithuanian students, on behalf of the Ministry of Education. These cards are provided in physical format.






2 How does the ESC work?

What is the ESC-Router (ESC-R)?

The European Student Card Router (ESC-R) is a platform that allows higher education institutions and other card issuers to issue and manage ESCs, as well as verify student status. The ESC-R was launched on the European Commission's cloud on 23 October 2024.

User categories in the ESC-Router (ESC-R)

The European Student Card Router (ESC-R) supports different kinds of user categories, including **higher education institutions**, **public authorities**, **and third-party processors**.


Public authorities issuing student cards at local, regional or national level in any EU/EEA Member State or European microstate



Third-party processors issuing student cards on behalf of higher education institutions or public authorities registered to the ESC-Router




How to issue ESCs through the ESC-R



After compiling the form, the registration is validated by the ESC helpdesk.

The card issuer adds the generated ESC Logo/QR code to their student cards, according to its own processes.






Log in via MyAcademicID or EU Login (or create an account) and submit a registration form for the ESC-Router

Access the ESC Router and **start creating ESCs** in the ESC-R through one of the available methods (*User Interface, API, CSV*)



HEIs can access the ESC-R and delegate the issuance of ESCs




Student status verification

When scanning the QR code* of a European Student Card to validate the status of a student, the **higher education institution** or **service provider** will be presented with a similar **validation screen**:



Note: For basic validation, no specific equipment is required to scan the QR code of a European Student Card. The QR code can be simply scanned with a smartphone or similar device.



For students



The ESC Service Catalogue will be a dedicated platform accessible to students, allowing them to search for and find services available to those holding a European Student Card.

For higher education institutions and service providers



The ESC Service Manager, the 'behind-the-scenes' version of the ESC Service Catalogue, is already available. Higher education institutions and service providers can easily list the services they provide to ESC holders through the ESC Service Manager.

Some key features of the service catalogue include:



Digital Catalogue

A digital directory of student services that accept the ESC



Filterable Listings

Easily search and filter services by city, country, and type



Map view

Browse through all the services available in a map view






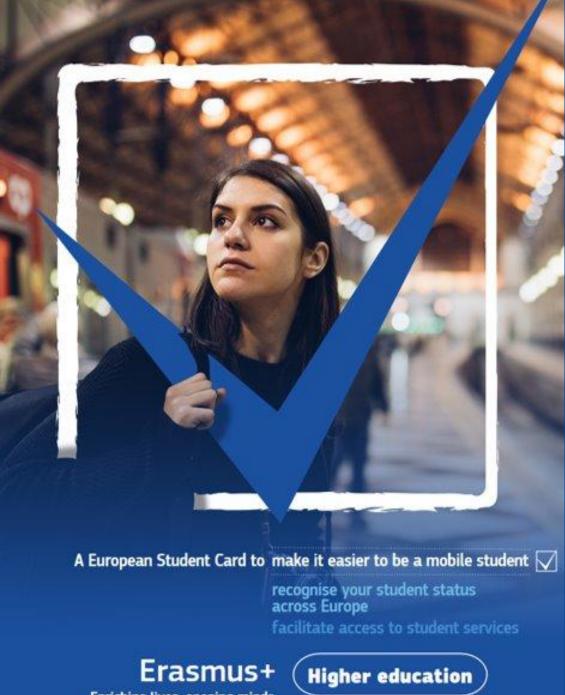

Verifiable Credentials Pilot

The ESC Verifiable Credential Pilot is an opportunity for a selected group of card issuers to test first-hand the issuance of the Digital ESC and have a say in the future development of the ESC. Two pilot scenarios :

- Issue Verifiable Credentials via the **ESC Router**.
- Issue Verifiable Credentials in a decentralised manner.

Benefits of the Digital ESC as a verifiable credential

A **Digital ESC** can play a great role in facilitating student mobility, as students can conveniently access their credentials and benefits through their mobile devices.

- Trusted and portable proof of student status
- Instant verification across institutions
- Privacy-preserving and scalable

Use case 1: Storing Digital ESC as Verifiable Credentials

Storing Digital ESCs as Verifiable Credentials



Business objective

Provide students with a secure, portable, and privacy-preserving ESC as a verifiable credential stored in a digital wallet.



Key actors

- Student (Cardholder) owner of the credential
- **Issuing Organisation** higher education institution, public authority, or authorised third party processor
- Talao Wallet



Preconditions

- The organisation must be registered in the ESC Router.
- The student is enrolled in a higher education institution.



Use case 2: Verifying and Displaying ESC as Verifiable Credentials

Verifying and Displaying ESC as Verifiable Credentials



Business objective

Enable a secure and privacy-preserving mechanism for verifying a student's status and access to services using a Digital ESC stored in a digital wallet.



Key actors

- Student (Cardholder) owner of the credential
- **Issuing Organisation** higher education institution, public authority, or authorised third party processor
- Verifier (e.g. International Office) requests and checks the credential
- Talao Wallet



Preconditions


The student has received and stored a Digital ESC in their wallet.

The verifying party has access to the verifier app.

The issuer's public key is accessible in ESC Router to allow for signature validation.

Draft the Digital Card specifications

The process underwent several iterations with DG EAC and included public consultations with key stakeholders



Develop the **technical groundwork** for issuing
digital ESCs as verifiable
credentials



Test the approach of issuing digital ESCs as verifiable credentials in a piloting phase

We worked with stakeholders to support implementation and follow up on pre-established criteria



Assess and present the **outcomes** to DG EAC

The verifiable credentials are intended to be an evolution and will be made available to all ESC-R users. Any card created will automatically be converted into a verifiable credential once the features are ready. **There is no reason to wait with the issuance of ESCs in the current form.**

ESCI Champions

The ESCI Champions initiative aims to recognise higher education institutions and organisations that have made significant progress in adopting the different building blocks of the European Student Card Initiative (ESCI).



ESCI Champions 2025-2027

- The **32** selected ESCI Champions were appointed for a period of two years (2025-2027) and will benefit from enhanced visibility, access to promotional and communication material to promote ESCI in their home country.
- ESCI Champions will participate in ESCI meetings, national events, and various outreach activities, including through sharing testimonials and best practices.
- The call on ESCI Champions for the period 2025-2027 was closed on 16 May with a total amount of 102 applications registered.






ESC Trainings & Resources
